



Sackville Farmers Market Eligible Products Policy

The Eligible Products Policy defines the guidelines for eligible products at the Sackville Farmers' Market.

All goods at the Sackville Farmers' Market must be locally grown, locally prepared or locally produced.

- Local is interpreted as produced within the Maritime Provinces: New Brunswick, Nova Scotia or Prince Edward Island. Priority will be given to items produced within 150 kilometers of Sackville, NB.
- Locally *produced* means that the goods are significantly transformed and not simply repackaged.
- Raw ingredients may originate from beyond the Maritimes if the item is transformed locally.

- Vendors must display signage at each Market day indicating the source and origin of each local product not of their own production.
- Vendors must supply a minimum of 50% of their own locally grown, prepared or produced products.
 - Resale items will be subject to additional vendor fees as follows:
 - If more than 50% of product offering is not grown or produced by the vendor a premium of two times the normal vendor fees will apply. (For example, if your normal vendor fee is \$15, you will be charged an additional \$15 for a total of \$30 for the additional resale items that are not grown or produced by the vendor)
- Vendors are subject to an annual review of the products they sell.
- If a vendor wishes to add products not in line with their current offering or change what they are selling, they must obtain prior approval from the Market Manager.
- The resale of purchased non-local beverages is strictly prohibited except for products sold by the Sackville Farmer's Market for fundraising purposes and by approved prepared food /hot beverage vendor.
- All product eligibility decisions are ultimately left to the discretion of the Market Manager.
